ABOUT DESTINATION UNKNOWN


We are a network of people and organisations in different parts of the world. We want to make sure that the rights of children and young people on the move are respected and protected. We dream of a world where all children and young people can have a good life, live safe from discrimination, and be free to follow their dreams.



ABOUT CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE ON THE MOVE

These children and young people may have left their home and moved somewhere in the same country or to a different country. They may have left their home alone or with family. They might have left to go to school, or to find a better life or safety. Moving might bring new opportunities. Moving might also come with risks. Other children and young people might not leave their home, but their parents leave to find work. All these children and young people have dreams and hopes. They have rights. And too often their rights are not protected or respected.

EXAMPLES OF HOW WE WORK

We **talk to governments** about what is happening and encourage them to change things so that children and young people have more protection and can enjoy their rights.

When we want to change something, we use evidence to show why and **we write about it, we talk about it, and we shout about it on social media** and try to get those people with power to listen and change things.

We **advise decision-makers to involve children and young people** when they make decisions.

We **help our members to talk to each other** about what they are doing so they can learn.

We **support youth to talk to people who make decisions** so that those decision-makers can hear what children and young people have to say.

WHO WE ARE

The Youth Ambassador Network

The children and youth in our [youth ambassador network](#) are a very important part of Destination Unknown. They tell us what changes they want to see, and we help them to work for these changes. We are now also creating a Youth Advisory Board - a smaller group within the network - to play an important role in shaping Destination Unknown.

The Members

By doing so, they help us to decide what the Destination Unknown network can try to change. They help to push for change in the country where they are working.

The Global Team

The Global Team are people who work for Destination Unknown every day to make the projects happen and to support the members.

The Steering Committee
