Objectives of the meeting

- With a specific focus on Children On the Move and Other Children Affected by Migration, to strategize ahead of the Global Forum on Migration and Development 2016 and related processes. Linking local, national, regional and global advocacy work follow-up and reflect on how to move the recommendations GFMD forward and the 19th September Summit output within a longer, multi-annual planning towards the GFMD 2017, GFMD 2018 and the HLD in 2019.
- To identify some next concrete steps specific to Children On the Move and Other Children Affected by Migration (vertical and bridging issues) to discuss whether civil society has the right structure to move all this forward with the needed alignment in the processes from local to global.

Common understanding of the meeting and objectives of the meeting

- This meeting is a “satellite GFMD meeting” specifically on Children On the Move and Other Children Affected by Migration. It is a contribution and does not substitute for other movements and initiatives, but rather serves to identify synergies between different initiatives.
- This meeting gives voice to national and regional advocacy experts on migration and development to link, create synergies and influence civil societies’ work at global level.
- The GFMD is a milestone where a number of synergies should come together, but it is not the only milestone for this movement.

³ We will explore approaches to addressing the root causes of displacement of children, and whether regional cooperation and/or approaches can support the development of actions to prevent, address and resolve the root causes of displacement and drivers of onward movement. We will highlight innovative approaches and methods of working with children, adolescents, young people and their families to strengthen family and community support structures to protect children from violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation.

⁴ We will provide an opportunity to discuss ways to increase access to solutions for children on the move in line with the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals. We will explore why the protection of children on the move is not only a legal and social responsibility but also an investment in the future.

⁵ Referring to the “Principles” and other current frameworks governing the rights of children, we will examine the gap between policy and practice with a focus on children on the move in countries of origin, transit and destination. Participants will be invited to discuss alternatives to detention, child-friendly procedures, the right to a legal identity and legal documentation, non-discriminatory access to service while emphasizing that formal processes for assessing the best interests of the child are a key element of child- sensitive asylum and migration policies and procedures.
